Welsh Water led a whole school assembly. The award-winning education team visited the school to give an assembly where they taught the children about all things to do with water! How they collect it, treat it, use it and clean it.

The interactive workshops were led by seconded teachers who educate children through the most creative lessons and equip children to become water ambassadors, with an understanding about climate change, community and Welsh Water's business messages.



Our 'Siarter Iaith' Crew had a great morning with pupils from St Roberts school. We taught them Welsh yard games which they will share with the rest of the school. *The main aim of the charter is to create an increase in the children's social use of Welsh. Yr4&5 enjoyed a learning workshop about life as a child in the mines.

Firstly, they looked at pictures/clips of the children of the mines during the industrial revolution, talking about the bakery of the children's work, to why they had to work in the pits.

Items were also passed around. Real items from the pits, e.g., helmets, lunchboxes, lamps, bible and much more!

Children also get to experience

- Crawling through a blackened tunnel, with a fake candle and helmet, to see how dark it was in the pits!
- Pulling a cart containing coal, to test how hard and heavy it was to pull the carts!
- Dress up in children's clothes, paint faces with black chalk, and take pictures in front of a background!
